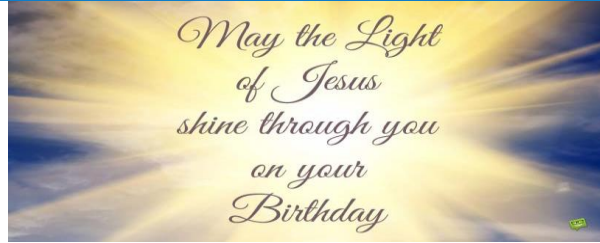

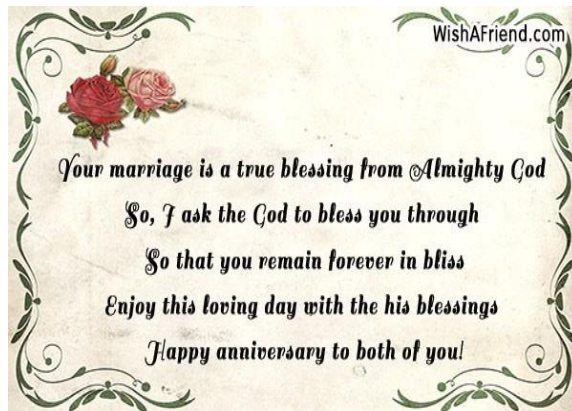

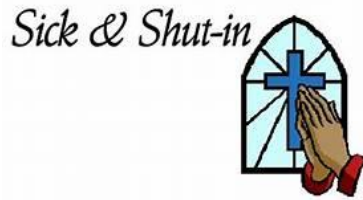
A Call to Remember
