Altar Flowers





Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment for Future Generations Camp Luther** \$20,000 With over 6,000 visitors to Camp Luther annually and a ministry that has shared the gospel of Christ for over 73 years, many individuals and generations have been affected by the mission of this camp. Shelly Karolus, Director of Donor Relations for Camp Luther reports the former facility was over 100 hundred years old and no longer met the growing needs of the ministry. Therefore, a new community center was built this past year to serve and uplift others through prayer, fellowship, and equipping them to share the love of Christ through the generations. The center is in need of furniture, fixtures and equipment for this building to ensure a successful future in providing year around programming to help everyone who visits build their relationship with Christ, preparing them to provide service and witness across the globe.
- **4. Introducing Muslims to the Savior Lutheran Heritage Foundation** \$7,500 With 3.45 million Muslim immigrants and refugees living in the USA and more than a dozen Islamic centers in North and South Wisconsin, there is a great need to have translated Lutheran books, such as Luther's Small Catechism and devotions, available to those surrounding churches. Many individuals from both North and South Wisconsin have requested materials for the Muslim populations. These are free resources that the women of North Wisconsin can share with Muslim acquaintances.
